19 INT. APARTMENT BUILDING LOBBY - NIGHT 19

Commissioner Gordon and Chief O'Hara pass through lobby and into elevator. Both are in full formal regalia. Elevator doors close. SUPER TITLES AND CREDITS OVER.

INT. ELEVATOR - NIGHT 20

20

They ride up. (This scene is primarily to give sufficient time for continuing CREDITS and TITLES.) The elevator comes to a stop and they EXIT.

21 INT. APARTMENT HALLWAY - NIGHT 21

They come INTO SHOT - walk down hall toward CAMERA, stopping in front of Barbara's apartment. Outside Barbara's door are (1) A DOORMAT, and (2) A NEWSPAPER, which has obviously been delivered by the local newsboy. Commissioner Gordon KNOCKS. No answer. As last TITLES FADES --

COMMISSIONER GORDON

(calling)

Barbara?

Still nothing. He and Chief O'Hara exchange a glance.

COMMISSIONER GORDON

That's odd, Chief O'Hara.

CHIEF O'HARA

Perhaps she stepped out for a minute, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER GORDON

But she knew we'd be here at

seven.

(points to paper) And that afternoon paper was delivered several hours ago -' why didn't she take it inside?

Another glance exchange, then Commissioner Gordon takes a key from under the doormat and OPENS the door.

22 ANGLE PAST THEM ON BARBARA'S EMPTY APARTMENT 22

Everything neat and orderly, but no trace of the occupant.

It's long distance.

INTERCUT:

PENGUIN

(nasal)

Your call is ready. Go ahead please.

(normal voice)

Hello, Commissioner. Guess who! Hwah, hwah, hwah!

COMMISSIONER GORDON

Penguin!

(to others)

It's Penguin!

PENGUIN

Just called to say hello, Commissioner. By the way, you haven't noticed anything missing lately, have you?

COMMISSIONER GORDON

Missing? Missing?

(shock as he gets

the point)

Barbara! You've got Barbara, you Feathered Fiend!

PENGUIN

Now, now, Commissioner, that's no way to talk to your daughter's.... guardian.

COMMISSIONER GORDON

Penguin, if you harm her, if you touch one hair on her head I'llI'll....

PENGUIN

(mocking)

Yes, Commissioner?

COMMISSIONER GORDON

I'11....I'11.....

He breaks down, sobbing. Bruce takes the phone from him as Chief O'Hara tries to comfort the stricken father.

BRUCE

Let me talk to him, Commissioner. (into phone)

Penguin? This is Bruce Wayne.

31 Cont.

PENGUIN

Well, well! The Millionaire Joyboy himself.

BRUCE

I'll pay whatever price you ask, Penguin. Just so long as Barbara Gordon is not harmed.

PENGUIN

Harmed? Faugh! I intend to make her the happiest girl in Gotham City! Take a look at this evening's Gotham City Tribune...!

BRUCE

The Gotham City Tribune?

PENGUIN

That's right, Wayne. The society page. Ta, ta.

BRUCE

(flashing)

Operator. Operator!

PENGUIN

(holding his nose, in nasal tone)

Yeeees?....

BRUCE

Operator, where did this call originate?

PENGUIN

(nasal)

We are sorry, the number you have reached is no longer a working number.

He laughs, hangs up.

32 RESUME - BARBARA'S APARTMENT

DICK

What was that about the Gotham City Tribune?

(picks up paper from table)

He said to look at the society page.

(opens paper)

Oh, no!

COMMISSIONER GORDON

What is it, Bruce? What does it say?

BRUCE

(reading)

'The Penguin, well-known entrepreneur and man about town, announced today his forthcoming marriage to Miss Barbara Gordon, daughter of Police Commissioner...'

Close to apoplexy, his eyes about to pop from his head like prune pits.

COMMISSIONER GORDON

MARRIAGE!

Commissioner Gordon rips the paper from Bruce's hands and looks for himself.

35 INSERT - PENGUIN AND BARBARA PHOTOS

Side-by-side photos of Penguin and Barbara, labeled "THE GROOM" and "THE BRIDE" respectively.

36 RESUME - WIDER ANGLE

36

COMMISSIONER GORDON What's going on? What does it mean, Bruce? Barbara would never consent to marry that scoundrel!

BRUCE

Of course not, Commissioner. That's why Penguin kidnapped her. He'll threaten her and try to force her consent.

COMMISSIONER GORDON

But why?

DICK

(getting it)

By marrying your daughter, Penguin becomes the son-in-law of the Police Commissioner!

BRUCE

Exactly, Dick. He hopes to gain immunity from prosecution by joining the family, as it were. I think he fully intends to go through with this, Commissioner.

COMMISSIONER GORDON There's only one man who can help me.

CHIEF O'HARA

Batman!

COMMISSIONER GORDON

Yes, Chief. Batman.

(moves toward door)
I'm afraid you'll have to go
without us, Bruce.

BRUCE

We're in no mood for the opera now, Commissioner. If there's anything at all I can do, call me at Wayne Manor.

COMMISSIONER GORDON

(choked up)

Thank you, Bruce. From the bottom of a father's heart.

CHIEF O'HARA

(arm around

Commissioner Gordon)

Come on, Commissioner, we'll go straight back to your office and call Batman.

Barbara has been untied and sits primly on her chair. Penguin removes her gag.

PENGUIN

Well, my little guinea hen, you and I will soon be joined by the bonds of holy matrimony.

BARBARA

All that waddling you do must have finally scrambled your brains, Penguin.

(sinister)

Let's not get cocky, my little chicken. If you won't marry me, I'll put Plan B into operation. (points o.s.)

Which is being rehearsed right over there.

38 WIDER ANGLE - INCLUDE HENCHMEN AND CUTOUT 38

Two HENCHMEN are aiming umbrella guns at a CARDBOARD CUTOUT OF COMMISSIONER GORDON. (The cutout is appropriately labeled.)

PENGUIN

Demonstrate Plan B to my little chickadee, boys.

BANG! BANG! The Henchmen riddle the Commissioner Gordon cutout, which topples over.

BARBARA

Penguin, you monster! You wouldn't dare hurt my father!

PENGUIN

(sharply)

I would and will. So you'd better make up your mind, my little sparrow. Either you become my wife, or an orphan. Which is it?

Barbara looks from Penguin to her cardboard daddy; what a choice!

PENGUIN

All right, boys, I can see we'll have to put Plan B into operation.

BARBARA

No! I'll marry you, Penguin. Just leave my father alone!

PENGUIN

That's more like it, my little gosling. Obedience is a proper wifely virtue.

(to Henchmen)

You two go out and put the snatch on a minister! Fast!

What kind of minister, Pengy?

PENGUIN

Any kind, you dolt! I want to get this marriage over with before the Dynamic Dunderheads get on the case and track me down!

HENCHMAN

(grins)
Don't worry, boss. We'll get
you to the church on time.

PENGUIN

(to Barbara, indicating a door)

And you'll find your wedding gown in this adjoining bedroom, my little nestling. Wear it with all the radiance of any blushing bride! Quack-quack.

BARBARA

I'm not blushing! I'm furious!

But she allows herself to be propelled into adjoining bedroom, as --

STRAIGHT CUT TO:

39 INT. WAYNE STUDY - NIGHT 39

WITH Bruce and Dick, still in their formal clothes as Bruce quickly activates Bard's head and Batpole doors open behind them. At the same time, Red Phone BEEPS.

BRUCE

That's the Commissioner, Dick. We'll pick it up downstairs.

40 ANOTHER ANGLE 40

They dash to the Batpoles and down.

41 BATPOLE SLIDE 41

Standard Batpole descent.

42 INT. BATCAVE - NIGHT 42

Duo EMERGES from poles and bound to Batphone.

BATMAN

(picks up phone)

Yes, Commissioner..... suspected as much. Robin and I knew something was wrong as soon as we saw the evening paper. We'll use the Batcomputer to make a list of possible Penguin hide-outs and call you as soon as it's finished. (earnestly)

We'll get her back, Commissioner.

43 ANOTHER ANGLE

43

Batman hangs up and they move to the Batcomputer.

ROBIN

Where's Alfred, Batman? He can give us a hand with the computations.

BATMAN

Unfortunately he's out for the evening, Robin. He's meeting . with his minister to discuss a church supper. We'll have to manage without him.

BAT SPIN TO:

44

The REVEREND EZEKIEL HAZLITT is discussing the forthcoming church supper with his deacon, ALFRED. (NOTE: The Reverend wears an ordinary business suit, not a collar.)

REVEREND HAZLITT I do hope the church supper is a success, Alfred. We badly need the money for our summer camp.

ALFRED

I'm sure it will be, Reverend Hazlitt.

REVEREND HAZLITT

If it is successful, the congregation will owe you a great debt of thanks...

ALFRED

All the thanks I need, sir, is the knowledge that some underprivileged youngsters will be able to enjoy a few weeks in the country this summer.

45 ANOTHER ANGLE

45

Penguin's Henchmen ENTER, umbrella guns drawn.

HENCHMAN

All right, which one of you is the Minister?

ALFRED

Why do you ask?

HENCHMAN

Because we're taking him with us, pops. Are you it?

Alfred looks at the drawn guns, and makes his decision.

ALFRED

(standing up)

Yes.

REVEREND HAZLITT

Wait---

ALFRED

(to Hazlitt)

I'll be quite all right, I assure you.

HENCHMAN

ALFRED

Of course.

As they start to leave --

Well, we'll have you out of there as soon as we pick this lock.
(to Robin)

Do you have the Bat-tools, Robin?

BATMAN

Now's not the time, Robin.
(takes Bat-tool)
Let's get to work on this lock.

Along which Batgirl makes her way back toward her own apartment.

82 RESUME - INT. HIDE-OUT - INCLUDE PENGUIN

While Duo work on the lock, Penguin has regained consciousness. He very carefully reaches for his umbrella, then loosens a cloud of GAS at them. They keel over.

PENGUIN

Quack-quack! So much for the Masked Meddlers.

83 ANOTHER ANGLE

83

Penguin runs around the room, prodding his Henchmen into action.

PENGUIN

Up, up, up! We've got to move to our alternate hide-out. few minutes the Gotham City fuzz will be all over this place.

84 ANGLE ON LOCKER

84

Penguin opens the locker and drags out several LARGE BURLAP SACKS.

PENGUIN

Bag the Dynamic Dimwits and drop them into our truck outside. We'll take care of them later. And bag the preacher and my prospective bride, too.

85 WIDER ANGLE

85

Henchmen begin stuffing Duo into sacks. Penguin unlocks bedroom with a spare key.

86 INT. BEDROOM

86

Henchmen ENTER, bag Alfred and the gowned dummy, and drag them out of the bodroom.

87 RESUME - MAIN ROOM

87

Fenguin stands near the window, gesturing impatiently.

PENGUIN

Hurry up, you clods! Throw them cut!

Henchmen drag their bags to the window and begin dropping them out.

88 EXT. LEDGE

88

Batgirl is moving along the ledge, but suddenly stops as she sees.....

89 STAKE TRUCK - HER P.O.V. 89

The truck is mattress-lined and parked underneath the window, and THUMP! BUMP! The burlap bags come sailing down into it.

A door in the wall OPENS and OUT ROARS Batgirl on her Batgirl-cycle.

96 RESUME - STREET

96

Penguin's truck DISAPPEARS around a corner, just as Barbara ROARS INTO SHOT and down the street after it.

BAT SPIN TO:

97 INT. ALTERNATE HIDE-OUT - NIGHT

97

Batman and Robin, heads protruding from the bags, are hanging over a LARGE CAULDRON from which STEAM RISES. The Alfred and Barbara bags are piled on the floor, as yet unopened. Penguin gloats over his captives.

PENGUIN

Well, Dynamic Dupes, how does it feel to be a couple of human tea bags, eh?

BATMAN

Steaming us to death will do you no good, Penguin. The law will track you down.

PENGUIN

Steam you to death? Horrible thought! Penguin would never perpetrate such an atrocity. I merely intend to boil you a little. Hwah-hwah!

ROBIN

(defiant)
You don't frighten us, Penguin.

PENGUIN

I don't want to frighten you, Boy Bumpkin. That could spoil the taste of my wedding punch. As you know, tea is the base of a good punch, and for mine I'm going to use a little Battea. But before I dunk you, I think I'll let my prospective bride out of the bag --- so she can see what will happen to her if she doesn't cooperate.

He opens one of the bags, but it turns out to be Alfred.

PENGUIN

You might as well watch the dunking, too, Preacher. In case you have any ideas about making trouble.

Alfred SHOVES Penguin, who sprawls on the floor.

ALFRED

Ooops, excuse me, sir.

The Henchmen pin Alfred's arms behind him.

PENGUIN

It's in the pot with you, too, Preacher, as soon as you've performed my wedding...

He leans over again to untie Barbara's bag, and now Alfred can do no more to delay him. But just as Penguin loosens the rope:

BATGIRL'S VOICE

(o.s.)

Before you throw everyone in the pot, Penguin...

standing in the doorway.

BATGIRL

...You may find yourself in hot water.

PENGUIN

Batgirl! How did you find this place?

BATGIRL

I just adore weddings, Penguin.

PENGUIN

(snarls)

Funerals before weddings, Batgirl. (to Henchmen)

Get her!

101 WIDER ANGLE 101 Henchmen rush Batgirl and the fight is on. 102 ANGLE ON ALFRED 102 He runs to the cauldron and begins freeing Batman and Robin. Penguin sees him and tries to drag him away, but Alfred squares off in Marquis of Queensburg stance and delivers several prim left jabs to the felonious button. 103 ANGLE ON DUO 103 ROBIN Alfred's really giving it to 'em, Batman. BATMAN So is Batgirl. 104 ON BATGIRL 104 dispatching a pair of hoods. 105 ON ALFRED AND DUO 105 Alfred unties them and they swing free to join the fray. 106 PANORAMIC CARNAGE 106 The whole gory scene, as Duo and Batgirl make mincemeat of the hoods. 107 ANGLE ON BATGIRL AND ALFRED 107 Batgirl ducks out of the fight to talk to Alfred. I had no intention of tricking you, Batgirl. I took Reverend Hazlitt's place only because I was afraid he might be injured by Penguin's thugs.

BATGIRL

(taking this in)
Then I apologize. It was a
brave thing to do, Alfred. But
the fact is that you do know my
secret---my dual identity. And
you must swear never to reveal
it---to anyone.

ALFRED

(reluctant)
Really, Batgirl, I...

BATGIRL

You must swear, Alfred! If my identity is revealed -- to anyone -- I will be of no further use as a crime-fighter!

Alfred hesitates.

BATGIRL

Remember I trusted you. Surely you wouldn't take advantage of a woman's trust. You must swear, as a gentleman's gentleman!

ALFRED

(a beat, then very solemnly)

Very well. You have my word as a - a - a gentleman's gentleman that no one will ever learn your secret from me.

BATGIRL

(touched) ank you. Alfred

Thank you, Alfred. (then:)

Now I must make a quick change...

Batman grabs Penguin and Robin bags him (leaving his head out.)

PENGUIN

Awk! Unhand me, poachers! Awk!

They hang the bagged Penguin on a hook next to his bagged Henchmen.

(looks around)

Alfred, where's Barbara Gordon?

ALFRED

WITH Bruce and Dick coming out of this office (so marked). Dick looking happy and Bruce proud.

BRUCE

You made a fine score on your driving test. How does it feel to have a license?

DICK

(confidentially)
It's going to be a little easier
on Batman, now that Robin can
drive the Batmobile.

BRUCE

Let's stick to Dick Grayson for a moment. How would you like to drive this?

During this, CAMERA HAS ANGLED THEM UP TO a new and gleaming convertible parked at the curb. Dick reacts with great surprise.

DICK

This? Me ... ???

BRUCE

Since you got your driver's license on your birthday -- (produces keys for car)

-- I think you deserve a little something special.

DICK

(takes keys, looks at car)

A little something?! Gosh, Bruce -- this is great ...

At this point, tumultuous POUNDING OF HORSES HOOFS IS HEARD RUSHING PAST THEM. Both look up.

DICK

What was that?

OLGA -- a beautiful, proud and stately woman in Tartar clothes and on a handsome horse -- RIDES INTO SHOT and gestures for Egghead to follow her. He does, and they ride OUT.

120 RESUME - BRUCE AND DICK

beside convertible.

DICK

Egghead!!! What do you suppose he's doing back in Gotham City? And that woman! She looked like a real Tartan Princess ...!

BRUCE

(very sober)

I suspect Batman and Robin may shortly get a call on the hot line. We'd better head for home ...

121 CLOSER ANGLE

Bruce gets into passenger's seat of convertible, Dick into driver's seat.

BRUCE

And don't drive this like a Cossack ...

DICK

I won't, Bruce. Highway safety is every citizen's prime responsibility.

As he starts car, CAMERA MOVES IN CLOSE ON Bruce.
